WHAT DO THE ARTS DO FOR LANCASHIRE?

We help Lancashire reach its potential. and the people who live here to realise what's possible.

Recreation, entertainment, education, social justice; health, the environment, innovation. Trust us,

we're the key to all of that. We're into everything and everyone. There's nothing that we don't impact.

We're the glue that binds your policy and integrates diversity. Not a nice to have, but a necessity, A vital part of the economy.

Speaking of which, let's start with the figures, we know these are important and it's good to have rigour,

So here some facts that prove our value and contribution to Lancashire's growth. and a positive future. There's 1,125 of us in 255 businesses but hundreds more work freelance and that's why the stats are ambiguous.

Our 11 NPO's bring in £4.5 million, and strategic funds worth another £1.3

Our two CPPs bring in £1.5million between them, supporting some of the most deprived in our region.

We play a big part in cultural tourism worth £4.25 billion at last tally –

Not a bad return for such a small investment from county and a key part of Lancashire's story.

But that's only really the half of it there's so much more to say about our impact on people and our communities, and the places that pave the way. You see, the arts tell the story of who we are as people, our character and history; of where we are, and what we're made of our landscape, our heritage and legacy.

We breathe life into places and connect places to people: animating, activating, engaging urban, coastal, rural.

We broaden horizons. We give voice to experience. We educate and advocate. We change minds and perceptions.

We're the ones who make difficult conversations happen. And the discussions that make a difference. We bring the big ideas to life and make them accessible to everyone.

We make people less lonely, less isolated and more connected. We help people be, or become, themselves. We're all about the collective.

We can change the moment. Enable action where there is uncertainty and fear. We can help to picture the future and make the way forward clear. We're fundamental. Not expendable. The arts impact us all. Which is why it's hard to imagine Lancashire without the arts at all.

But with the dissolution of the arts service team and considerable cuts to funding that's the future we're facing now that's what we're confronting.

Without genuine local investment the arts are struggling to level up, putting Lancashire at greater risk of losing what makes it so special

and what keeps the tourists flocking in; what makes businesses want to invest; what makes people want to live here; and study and work and the rest.

We know County Council doesn't want this to happen and that you're committed to supporting the arts. So, we've put a plan together to show you how you can start.

With more investment at a local level we can bring in more strategic support that will help us to build capacity and skills and opportunities to generate more collaborations, co-commissions, and programmes, cross-sector partnerships too. We're so keen to strengthen our sector because we know what will happen when we do:

Lancashire will reap the benefits its people, its economy, will grow and the value that arts and culture creates will truly start to show.
